More and more people had become followers of Jesus. They shared their food and money and often met together to pray and to praise God. They told everyone they met the good news about Jesus. The priests and rulers in Jerusalem were determined to stop the message of Jesus, so many Christians had to leave Jerusalem and travel far and wide. Peter was imprisoned, Stephen was stoned to death, whilst many more were punished in other ways. This is called 'persecution'.
